- NICE Palliative & Supportive Care Guidance 2004
- Part of NHS End of Life Care Programme 2004
- Adapted for Care Homes 2005



Gold Standards Framework in Care Homes Programme

- To improve end of life care
- To improve primary care collaboration
- To reduce numbers transferred to hospital




• To produce guide for others



Aim of the Framework

is to develop a Care Home based system to improve the organisation and quality of care of residents in the last year of life





The Key Tasks or 7 Cs

- Communication
- Co-ordination
- Control of symptoms
- Continuity out of hours
- Continued learning
- Carer support
- Care of the dying



Communication

- Identification of residents in last year of life set up Supportive Care Register
- Regular Review Meetings
 - Multi-disciplinary approach
 - To anticipate needs
 - To plan
- Advanced Care Planning



Co-ordination

- Identified GSF coordinator
- Maintaining supportive care register / review of residents
- Liaison with primary care teams & specialists



Control of Symptoms

- Assessment tools for Symptom Control, local guidelines for palliative care
- Regular review of care Plan /Dying Plan
- Appropriate use of specialist palliative care



Continuity

- Use of Out of hours handover form
- Closer working with specialist palliative care services
- Use of a Home Information pack for residents and families



Continued Learning

- Review meetings
- Significant Event Analysis
- Team identifying own learning needs
- Use of Macmillan Foundations in Palliative Care for Care Home Staff



Carer Support

- Introduce at a Relatives Meeting
- Information and home packs
- Bereavement or After Death Plan



Care of the Dying

- Anticipatory care
- Minimum Protocol for Care in the Final Days
- Liverpool Care Pathway



What difference has it made?

- Opened up discussions on death and dying
- Given nurses & carers confidence to keep residents in the home
- Reduced number of admissions to hospital in last days of life


